And this year you can build even more. As you can see from the pages which follow, there are trains, little cars, big lorries, planes, boats, cranes, dolls house furniture, kitchens.

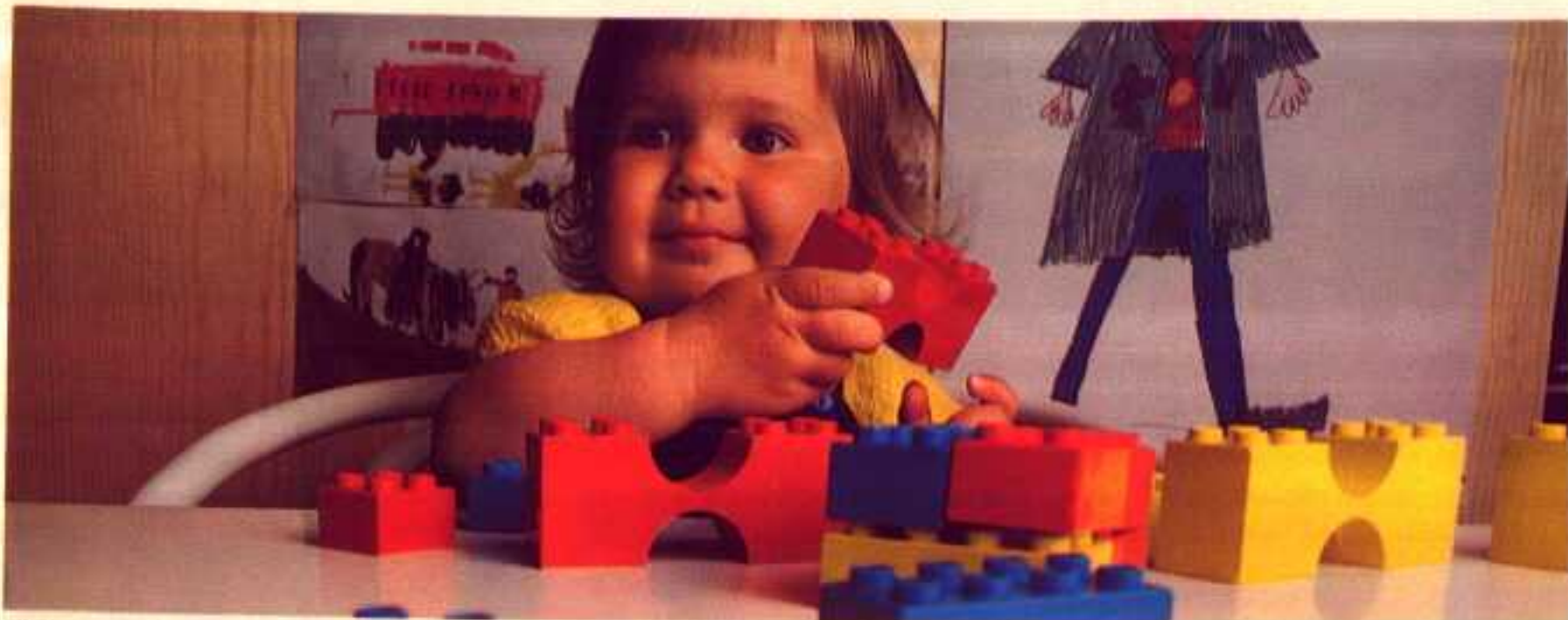
When you've built a model and played with it for a day or so, you can take it apart and build something completely different with the bricks. Just as Maria did.

This year there are many new basic sets to choose from.

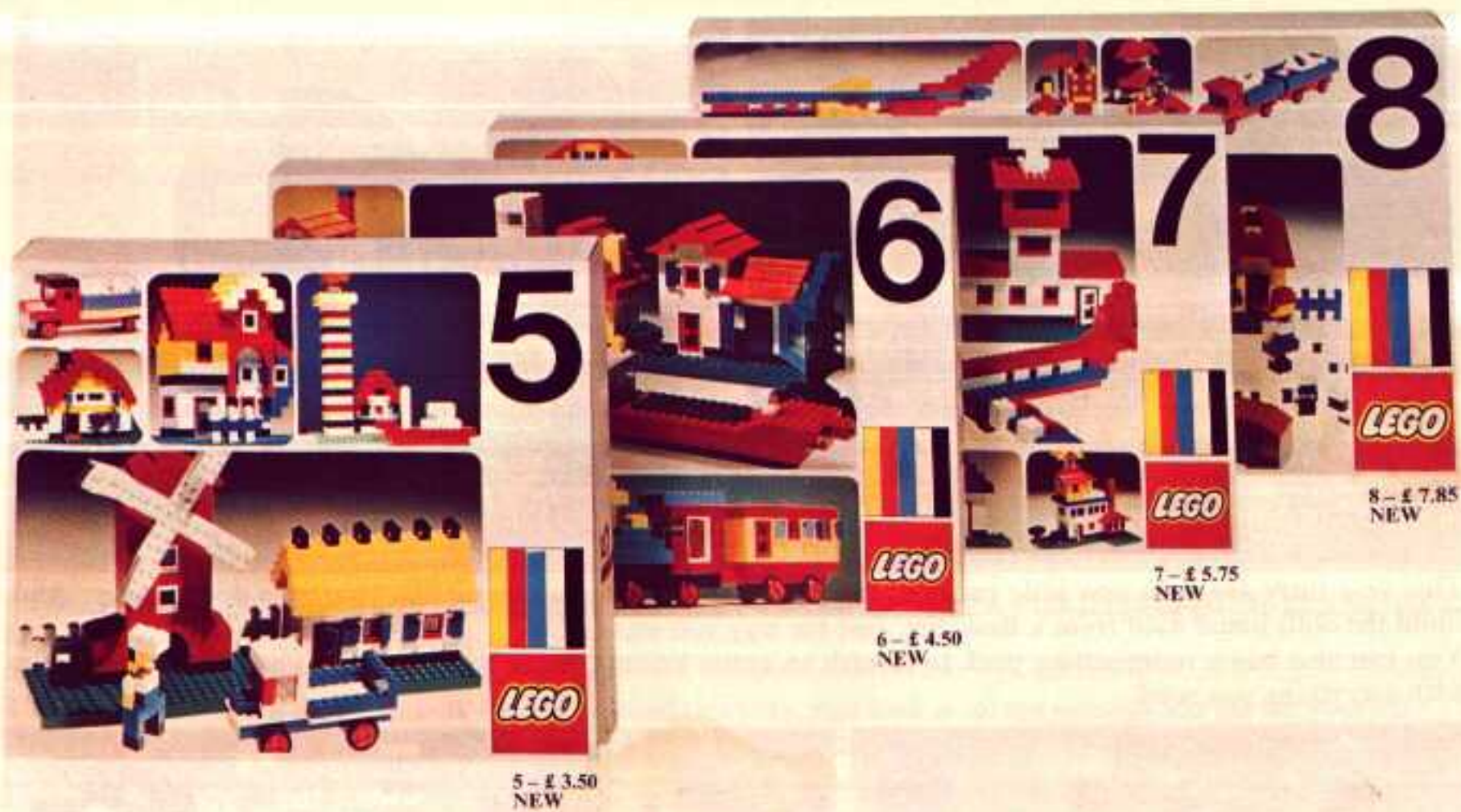

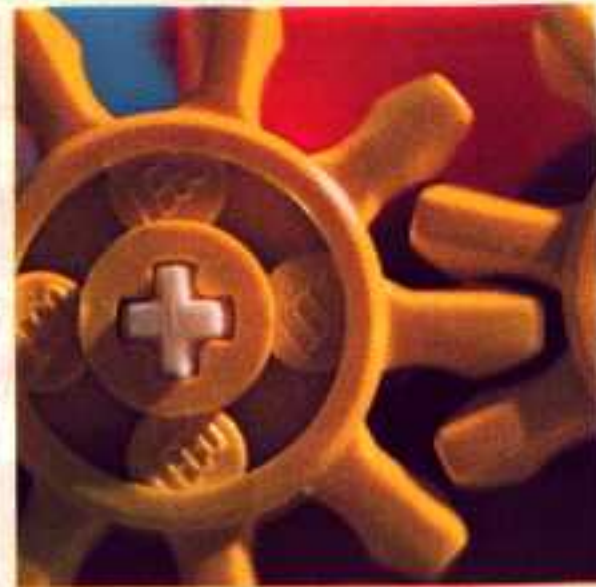
The gears really get the imagination going. But you will need to be five or six years old before you build something like this yourself.

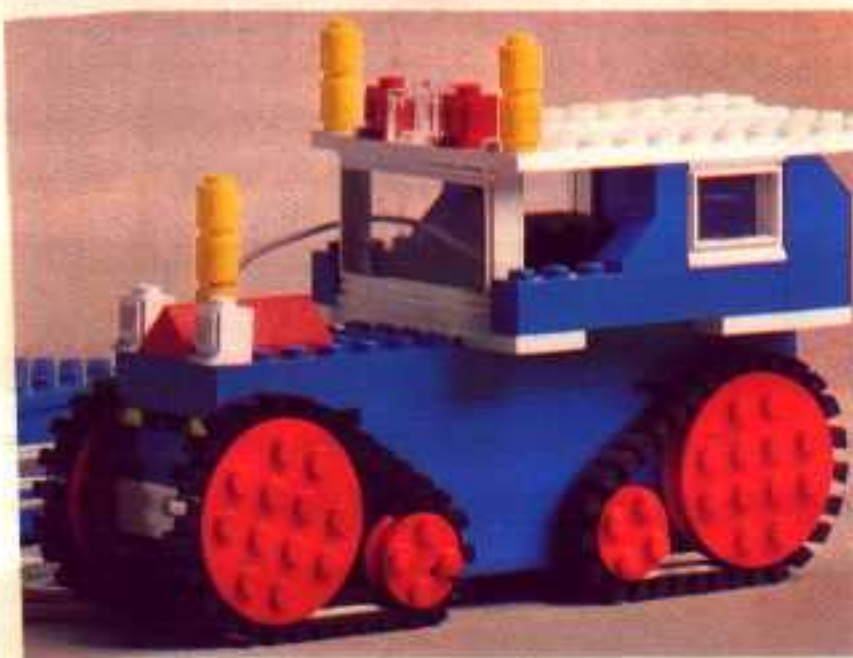


Motor

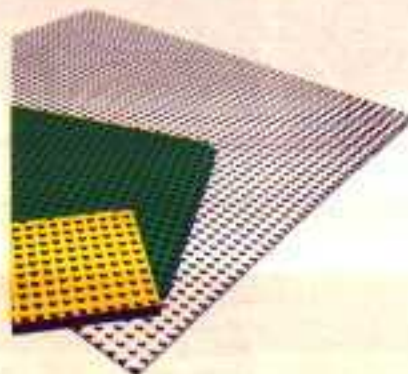


